College Scholarships Policy

College Scholarships shall be awarded to undergraduate students on the basis of excellent academic performance, i.e. where a student is working at a first-class level.

Scholarships are worth £100 per year.

Recipients of a College Scholarship are permitted to wear a Scholars Gown (to be purchased at their own expense).

Nomination

Undergraduates will normally be nominated for a Scholarship upon achieving Distinction or First in the First Public Examination. Names will be collated by the Academic Office for approval by the Academic Group and by Governing Body. Tutors have right of veto for students in their subject.

Tutors may nominate undergraduates in their subject for a College Scholarship at any point on the basis of sustained excellent academic performance.

Nominations should be made to the Senior Tutor for approval by the Academic Group and by Governing Body.

Renewal

Scholarships must be renewed in Michaelmas Term of each year. Renewals are to be approved by the Academic Group and Governing Body.

Tutors may recommend that a Scholarship not be renewed where a student's performance falls consistently below II(i) level.

Deprivation

Scholarships may be rescinded where a student's performance falls consistently below II(i) level, or a student's non-academic conduct is deemed to be below the standard expected of a College Scholar.

Nominations for deprivation should be submitted to the Senior Tutor. If a proposed deprivation is on the grounds of academic performance, the nomination must be made by the student's Tutor(s). If a proposed deprivation is on the grounds of non-academic conduct, the nomination must be made by the Dean or by the student's Tutor(s).

Deprivations of Scholarships must be approved by Academic Group and by GB.
